WEEK 5: COATS – MATTHEW 21:1-11



In Jesus' day, your outer coat was your most important piece of clothing.

Coats were even exempt from seizure by the court under Jewish law (*m. B. Qam 8:6*) around this time.

**They didn't cast their coats down
because they were *unimportant*;
they did so to highlight that Jesus
was *more important*.**



**Notice that Jesus is doubly
elevated on the coats of the
crowd *and his disciples.***

**Jesus knew even better than
the crowds that some things
are more precious than coats.**

**What they laid down for
Jesus did not compare to
what Jesus would lay down
*for them—and for us.***
