Deacons provide leadership in the serviceoriented and administrative matters pertaining to the physical needs of the church (Acts 6:1-4; 1 Timothy 3:8-13). Based on the scriptural qualifications, men who are called to be deacons serve in areas like finances (1 Timothy 3:8), administration (1 Timothy 3:12), visitation (1 Timothy 3:11), and ministering to the needs of the church family (Acts 6:1-4). According to the church's constitution and bylaws, First Baptist Church Meridian must maintain an active deacon body of 36 members. Each year, twelve deacons rotate off, and twelve new deacons are elected to serve a threeyear term. This rotation allows for continuous renewal and fresh perspectives within the deacon body, while also providing experienced deacons the opportunity to rest and reflect before being eligible for re-election. During the month of August, church members are invited to suggest potential deacons. This is an opportunity for the congregation to identify individuals who exemplify the qualities described in 1 Timothy 3. After this initial nomination phase, the pastor, current deacons, and the Committee on Committees engage in conversations with the potential candidates to further assess their suitability. This vetting process ensures that those nominated are well-prepared and committed to serving the church with integrity and dedication.

In 1 Timothy 3, the Apostle Paul outlines specific qualifications for individuals who aspire to serve as deacons in the church . These qualifications are essential for maintaining the integrity and effectiveness of church leadership. Paul empha-

sized that a deacon must be dignified, not double-tongued, not given to excessive drinking, and not greedy for dishonest gain. They must hold to the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience, demonstrating their commitment to the teachings of Christianity. Additionally, they should first be tested and found blameless before taking on the responsibilities of a deacon. Paul also highlights the importance of family life in the qualifications for deacons. A deacon must be faithful to their spouse and manage their children and household well. This reflects the idea that those who serve in the church should also exhibit strong moral and ethical standards in their personal lives. The role of a deacon is one of service and support within the church, and these qualifications ensure that those who are chosen are capable of upholding the values and mission of the church effectively. By adhering to these guidelines, the church can select leaders who will serve with integrity, dedication, and a clear commitment to their faith. I would encourage you to prayerfully consider which names you will submit during this process.
